

Riparian Protection: We work with landowners to improve streamside buffers that reduce erosion and improve water quality and habitat. We planted 3800 trees and shrubs along the Allen Brook (Williston); Stevens Branch (Barre); Dog River (Northfield and Berlin); and Winooski River (Marshfield).

Stormwater Management: We worked on a variety of stormwater projects, including construction of a bioretention facility along the Dog River and design of another in Plainfield, installation of a rain garden at the Hunger Mountain Coop, painted rain barrels, a build your own rain barrel workshop in Barre, and residential site assessments.

We partnered with the Regional Planning Commission to complete a study of water quality impacts from dirt roads in the Headwaters towns (Cabot, Marshfield and Plainfield).

Water Quality Monitoring: The Friends facilitated three volunteer water quality monitoring programs: the Headwaters (Plainfield, Marshfield and Cabot); the Four Rivers area (Winooski & Dog Rivers, Stevens & North Branches); and on several urban streams in the lower Winooski as part of the Chittenden County Stream Team.

We completed a comprehensive assessment of the stormwater systems in Plainfield, Marshfield and Cabot with the goal of identifying and correcting non-stormwater pollution from reaching waterways

Education and Outreach: In addition to several river flume demos, we gave talks at schools and community forums throughout the watershed on river processes, flood resiliency and stormwater management. We helped the Calais Lakes & Streams Committee produce a newsletter on controlling road and driveway runoff.

We engaged several hundred students and community members in volunteer projects.

Fish Passage & Habitat: Many culverts in Vermont are barriers to fish passage, causing fragmented habitat and isolated populations. We completed engineering designs for four projects in the watershed. Construction is planned for 2014.

River Access: We brought together paddling enthusiasts and area land managers to identify priority access projects along the Winooski River. We worked with local volunteers to construct a new access at the Martin Bridge Park in Marshfield.

2014 Projects & Goals

- Continue work with landowners on riparian protection and restoration
- Expand stormwater education programs including residential onsite assessments
- Focus water quality monitoring programs on identifying pollutant sources
- Complete fish passage projects on Crossett Brook and Beaver Meadow Brook
- Implement additional stormwater control projects
- Improve river access and lead group paddling trips
